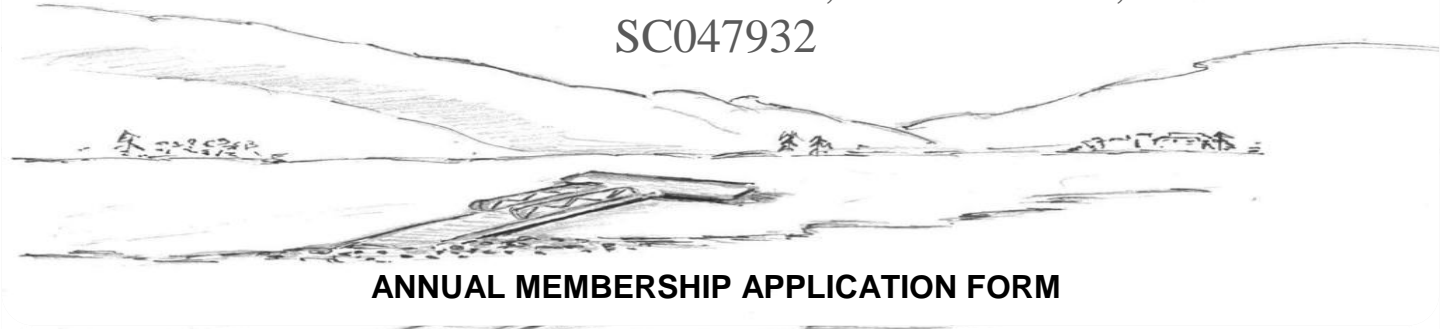

Status

Loch Long Jetty Association is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SC047932).

Our purpose is:

The provision of recreational facilities, or the organisation of recreational activities, in particular, but not exclusively, the development, maintenance and management of pontoons/jetties on Loch Long in the Arrochar region, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the persons for whom the facilities or activities are primarily intended.

Qualifications for membership

Membership is open to any individual aged 16 or over who is resident in the area bounded by the Arrochar, Tarbet and Ardlui Community Council area.

A member must act in the interests of the Loch Long Jetty Association and seek, in good faith, to ensure the Loch Long Jetty Association acts in a manner which is consistent with its charitable purposes.

Any person who wishes to become a member must sign a written application for membership; the application will then be considered by the board at its next board meeting.

The board may, at its discretion, refuse to admit any person to membership.

The board must notify each applicant promptly (in writing or by e-mail) of its decision on whether or not to admit him/her to membership.

Membership subscription

The annual membership subscription for 2021 has been set at £5. This will be reviewed and set annually at the Annual General Meeting of the Association.

Liability of members

The members of the organisation have no liability to pay any sums to help to meet the debts (or other liabilities) of the organisation if it is wound up; accordingly, if the organisation is unable to meet its debts, the members will not be held responsible.

Benefits for members

The members have the right to attend members' meetings (including any annual general meeting) and have important powers under the constitution; in particular, the members appoint people to serve on the board and take decisions on changes to the constitution itself. Members can receive copies of the Minutes from Board Meetings if requested.
